Attendance Matters

Regular school attendance is an important part of giving your child the best possible start in life. Our attendance for the year is currently **93%.** Following on from our recent Ofsted and the Department of Education's drive on improving attendance, attendance remains a high priority at Rowner Junior School.

We pride ourselves on working alongside our parents/carers in ensuring that their child(ren) attends school regularly, but understand that sometimes there may be barriers to this. The protocols that the school follows for non-attendance are there to be as supportive as possible. Our intention is to identify and address the challenges that are resulting in the poor attendance.

As part of our attendance protocols we do the following:

- Keep parents/carers updated on attendance via letters, newsletters and our websites
- Report to parents/carers on how their child is achieving in school and how their child's attendance is impacting on this
- Monitor individual learner attendance
- Review attendance on a regular basis and identify any learner falling below 90%. If your child's attendance is below 90%, we identify, monitor and review trends and patterns in attendance. If your child's attendance falls below 90% you will be notified of this in a letter. In most cases, we will monitor this, however in some cases you might be invited in for a meeting to complete an attendance plan. In an attendance plan we will look at what the barriers to school are from the school's parents and pupils perspective and draw an action plan to amend this. This will be reviewed regularly.

We hope that the supportive process above will lead to improved attendance. However if the poor attendance continues then a referral will be made to the Legal Intervention Team, who will work with families on overcoming the barriers to their child's poor attendance.

Industrial Action

INDUSTRIAL ACTION from members of the NEU is currently scheduled for Thursday 2 March, Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March. Please see the email sent to you on Thursday 23 February regarding the March strikes. If there are any changes to this we will inform you as soon as we know e.g. the government are talking with the NEU which may change their position.

Jewellery

We have seen an increase in children wearing more jewellery - rings, necklaces, large hooped earrings. A reminder of our expectations for jewellery:

Jewellery: Children should not wear any jewellery (with the exception of watches) apart from a single or pair of **stud** *earrings* in pierced ears. The school cannot accept any responsibility or liability for mislaid personal jewellery. To help keep your child safe, earrings need to be removed for PE lessons. We suggest they are not worn at all on PE days.

Learning and Pastoral Team (LAPS)

This term, we have introduced a LAPS Team to the school that will complement the work already carried out by Mrs Fuller. We are delighted to inform you that Mrs Connor and Mrs Baker Le-Cras are our new Learning Mentors. They have a dedicated area in school - The LAPS Ledge in the lower school corridor in order for them to work with and help our children. We are currently furnishing this area to make it comfortable. They will be on the playground every day at the start and end of the day in order that they are available for parents/carers to speak to with any matters that need to be brought to the schools' attention. Our Learning Mentors will support pupils who may be struggling with their learning, behaviour and social or emotional needs. They will do this by working in partnership with staff and parents/carers to identify and address pupils' concerns. Other key work will include:

- Developing a 1:1 mentoring and small group sessions for our learners
- Develop the social and independence skills of our learners whilst providing support when it is needed. Monitor attendance and work with key colleagues and families to improve low attendance

Outdoor Learning/Groundforce Day

We are hosting two 'Ground Force Days' this year and our first is this month - **Tuesday 28 March**. The whole school will be participating in a range of gardening, landscaping and outdoor learning opportunities, at different times, throughout the day. Adult support with helping with the grounds, independently or alongside your child will be very much appreciated. Adults will be working outside and can work with other adults or their child. Please bring some tools with you to help - secateurs, rakes, spades etc would be really useful as we have a limited supply (make sure they are named). Donations of good quality plants, old metal pots and pans for the mud kitchen, scaffold planks, bricks and tarpaulin would be very much appreciated. Please complete this <u>Google form</u> to commit to helping on the day. Children are to come to school in clothes you do not mind getting grubby or paint on and should bring their wellies or suitable outdoor shoes. Please ensure Y3 have trainers so PE can still be an option without the need for changing.

Red Nose Day

Red Nose Day is Friday 17 March. Due to our recent British Heart Foundation awareness and fundraising, we <u>will not</u> be selling red noses in school or dressing in red. However, if your child already has a Red Nose or Comic Relief accessories, they are very welcome to wear them (named) with their school uniform.

SATs meeting

If your child is in Year 6, they will be completing their Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) w/b 8 May. The children will not be at school on 8 May (King's Coronation) so we are keen to ensure they are as prepared as possible for their SATs week.

We are inviting parents / carers to attend a meeting on Monday 27 March (Sycamore class) from 15.15 - 16.00. The session will talk through what your child can expect during SATs week and how you can support your child as well as give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.

The session is for adults. Please make arrangements for your child.

We have included a Y6 SATs meet <u>Google form</u> for you to indicate if:

- you will be joining us for a SATs information session on Monday 27 March
- you require Home Learning to be provided for your child at Easter

Please note, SATS are not about passing or failing, but instead show the level your child is working to. Your child will be given a 'scaled score' (a score of 100 or more means a pupil is meeting the expected governmental standard) which we will share with you. Your child's secondary school will use the scaled score to help inform them which class your child will be learning in. Please complete this form by Friday 10 March. It closes at midday.

School crossing

As you would have noticed, Sue, the School Crossing Patrol Officer who is normally directly outside of school, has not been here for a period of time. We have received notification from Hampshire County Council that she has handed in her resignation and therefore will not be returning to her role. We are sure that you will all join us in thanking her for her services. Hampshire County Council also informed us that they have recently completed a survey to determine whether the number of children crossing and the volume of traffic meet the requirement for someone else to take on this role. Their findings have shown that a new Patrol Officer is not justified and therefore they will not be recruiting a School Crossing Patrol Officer for outside school.

Science in Schools community workshop

British Science Week is on 10 - 19 March. In light of this, the children will be taking part in workshops on Tuesday 21 March that are being run by the Royal Institute of Science.

On this day, parents and carers are also invited into school to attend a workshop from 15.15 - 16.15. We will send further information out about this closer to the time.

World Book Day and Readathon Event
