Bay House Build Exhibition

You are warmly invited to learn more about the Bay House build project on Thursday 20 April from 16.00-19.00, in the Marine Centre at Bay House. To accommodate the new build, six buildings, two temporary classrooms and numerous stores and containers will be demolished, including various outbuildings and bin stores in front of Bay House; and they will be replaced with three new buildings, to allow for an enhanced landscape and more space for recreation. The new building will join up with existing retained buildings to provide a much more accessible school and college Environment. It is a very exciting project!



Catering Costs

CATERING COSTS will be increasing on the 1 April by 15p - each school meal will cost £2.65. The costs will increase again from 1 September to £2.80. The GFM have tried to keep the costs to £2.50 but can no longer sustain this. H3CS have been charging £2.80 since October last year - we are pleased to have kept costs as low as possible for the time that we have.

Coronation of King Charles

Planning is well underway for the Coronation of King Charles and we are set to celebrate with Rowner Infant School on **Friday 5 May.** Please send your child to school in red, white and blue clothing (there will be no PE on this day). You may like to send them to school with a tiara or crown - bought or homemade.

The afternoon's celebrations will include a shared picnic lunch, a musical ensemble of music from the coronation official playlist, but most importantly an opportunity to commemorate the King's Coronation by coming together as a community.

Whilst each school will be providing a picnic lunch for the children, families are requested to bring in their own picnics for both themselves and/or any children that do not wish to partake in the picnic lunch provided by school. If your child attends Rowner Junior School you will receive a Google Form to indicate what your child would like to eat.

Families are invited to arrive at Rowner Junior school from 12.15. Children from the junior school will be on the playground, where they can be collected from their teacher before collecting your infant school child (if applicable). The picnic will then take place on the field between both sites. The event will run **until 14.00** when you will be able to take your child home. To help ease this process, children will return to class at 13.45 to be registered and can then be collected by their parents from their class.

Internet safety

As a school we take the safety of our pupils very seriously including their safety while they access the internet. E-Safety is taught in each year group at an appropriate level and this approach to e-safety spreads to the home online environment too.

We recognise that the internet is an amazing resource which enables children and young people to connect, communicate and be creative in a number of different ways, on a range of devices. However, the internet is always changing, and being able to keep up to date with your children's use of technology can be a challenge. You may sometimes feel that your children have better technical skills than you do, however children and young people still need advice and protection when it comes to managing their lives online.

Issues that your child may encounter on the internet will vary depending on their age and online activities, however communication between yourselves and your child is key in keeping your child safe online. Some simple actions can help to keep your child safe. For example:

- monitor the time they are spending online
- regularly check what they are viewing
- Have the computer/use devices in a communal area where it is easier to monitor what your children are viewing. Do not let children have webcams, or similar, in their bedroom. Remember any image, sound or text can be copied and viewed by everyone.
- Regularly discuss online safety and go online with your child. Communication is key to 'staying safe online'. Encourage your children to tell you if they feel uncomfortable, upset or threatened by anything they see online.
- Keep virus and firewall software uptodate. Enable your 'browser safe' search option and/ or consider using internet filtering software, walled gardens and child-friendly search engines. Critically view all content as some websites are not what they appear.

We have also committed to monthly parent newsletters to support you in navigating online safety.

Our swimming programme begins after the Easter holiday. Please see the table above for your child's swimming schedule. This will form part of the PE curriculum for the summer term and will take place at Brune Park school. Swimming is part of the National Curriculum and therefore <u>all</u> children are expected to take part.

Children need to have the appropriate swimwear, **not beachwear**, boy's trunks should be above the knee in length and girls must wear a one piece swimming costume. Goggles are permitted if your child would prefer to wear them. Long hair needs to be tied back and we encourage jewellery to be left at home – no earrings please on the days when they are swimming. We encourage children to wear swimming caps. Children will also need to

bring a towel and waterproof bag to bring their kit into school. If children wear their swimming costumes to school as it is a morning session, please ensure they have underwear to change into. All swimming kit and school uniform needs to be named.

Year 6 SATs

SATs have been scheduled for Year 6 by the government this year commencing the week beginning 8th May, however with the bank holiday on Monday 8th May, the assessments will now run from Tuesday to Friday.

The school is committed to ensuring pupils make progress throughout their learning journey at Rowner and can account for this accordingly. We will share attainment information with Y6 parents/carers in our annual reports (July) and liaise closely with secondary schools to inform them about Year 6 respectively.

A number of parents have been asking us about transition for their children in Year 6

Transition is a major event not only for a young person but also for the family members that support their child. It is therefore our aim to ensure that the transition journey is enjoyable, informative and exciting. A move to a new school and organisation is a significant time for any family. For some, transition will be an exciting time. For others, this will be a time of nervousness.

Our transition process is already well underway with our Year 6 pupils having been informed of their secondary school allocation and those children in Y2 having also been informed of their new junior school.

Our Year 6, as always, are well supported in the next stage of their journey - whether they are staying as part of the GFM in our 'school family' or attending other local secondary schools. Transition conversations have already started with our secondary colleagues and will continue to happen over the coming months.

Across our GFM schools, colleagues from Brune Park and Bay House are in school regularly to see what we do in the Primary Phase, this is from both an academic and personal and social perspective, so that they have a clear understanding of the whole child.

Our Year 2s will receive a warm welcome and opportunities to learn more about us, our approach and have opportunities to preview KS2 learning. For those transitioning to a new year group, there will be opportunities to meet the new teacher and learn a little about what life will be like in the new year groups. Your child's new teacher will be shared with you in their end of year report.
