Attendance

Regular school attendance is an important part of giving your child the best possible start in life. Our attendance for the year is currently **94%** which is in line with the national average. Following on from our recent Ofsted and the Department of Education's drive on improving attendance, attendance remains a high priority at Rowner Junior School.

We pride ourselves on working alongside our parents/carers in ensuring that their child(ren) attends school regularly, but understand that sometimes there may be barriers to this. The protocols that the school follows for non-attendance are there to be as supportive as possible. Our intention is to identify and address the challenges that are resulting in the poor attendance.

As part of our attendance protocols we do the following:

- Keep parents/carers updated on attendance via letters, newsletters and our websites
- Report to parents/carers on how their child is achieving in school and how their child's attendance is impacting on this
- Monitor individual learner attendance
- The Pastoral Team will make contact with parents to offer support and advice regarding attendance. This might be if your child's attendance is below 90% and they are absent or if there are issues around the child not attending school.
- Review attendance on a regular basis and identify any learner falling below 90%. If your child's attendance is below 90%, we identify, monitor and review trends and patterns in attendance. If your child's attendance falls below 90% you will be notified of this in a letter. In most cases, we will monitor this, however in some cases you might be invited in for a meeting to complete an attendance plan. In an attendance plan we will look at what the barriers to school are from the school's parents and pupils perspective and draw an action plan to amend this. This will be reviewed regularly.

We hope that the supportive process above will lead to improved attendance. However if the poor attendance continues then a referral will be made to the Legal Intervention Team, who will work with families on overcoming the barriers to their child's poor attendance.

Christmas (yes, you read that correctly)

We know, we have not even had our summer holidays but we are already thinking about Christmas! In the past couple of years we have used a company that turns your child's festive drawing into cards, wrapping paper and a range of gifts. Whilst we will not be completing this until **September/October**, we wanted to take this opportunity to give you a rough guide on costs for these items so that families can plan ahead. Expectations on school site

As a school, we have a responsibility to keep our pupils, staff and community safe, especially whilst on the school site and we work hard to develop strong relationships with our children and their families. We expect adult behaviours to model; kindness, care and high challenge, and place high value on mutually respectful, supportive relationships. This is done in partnership with staff, with pupils and families to advocate positive behaviours.

To support this, parents have a responsibility to support the school's vision, aims, values and maintain a respectful and responsible manner whilst on the school site to all pupils/parents/visitors and staff.

Can we also remind you of the following:

- The junior school site is not open until 8.40 and there should be no pupils or parents on the school site until that time;
- Whilst on both the junior and infant sites, you are **responsible** for your child and should be **supervising** them accordingly at both the start and end of the day;
- On the **infant site**, children are **not to play in the learning areas** e.g. reception forest school, play area etc;
- If children play on the **junior gym area**, they must be **supervised by their adult**;
- Bikes and scooters should be walked whilst on school site (a reminder that these should also be locked);
- Families should aim to leave the school sites as soon as possible.

Multiplication Tables Check - Year 4

After half term, year 4 will be taking part in the Multiplication Tables Checks (MTC). The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.

The checks are due to take place from Monday 5th June to Friday 16th June. All children will take part in these assessments and the results will be shared with parents in the end of year reports.

The year 4 children have been practising and working towards this throughout the year and we know that they will all try their very best!

Staffing

We would like to welcome Miss Harding and Mrs Scott to the RJS teaching team. Whilst they will be officially joining us in September, they will be visiting us on the transition day on Thursday 14th July where they will be spending time with their new class. Summer Uniform

Summer uniform includes:

- Maroon jumper/cardigan/ (ideally with school logo) with a maroon or white polo type shirt with a collar.
- For boys: Grey or black trousers or shorts and short white, grey or black socks.
- For girls: Grey or black trousers, shorts or culottes or dark red gingham dresses, or playsuits or gingham blouse and skirt to be worn as a two piece, long or short white, grey or black socks.
- Sensible black shoes (**no trainers** unless all black and shoe like) or sensible/supportive black or white sandals (these must have a back on them) and trainers for PE days.
- Light weight sensible coat.

Our PE kit includes:

- Plain black shorts or cycling shorts no logos
- Plain white round neck t-shirt
- Maroon jumper/cardigan (ideally with school logo) zipped baseball sports jacket with Team Rowner lettering on the back
- Socks (barefoot for indoor PE)
- Trainers
- Tracksuit bottoms or leggings in black (no text or logos) for winter months
- Black base layers

Our school uniform expectations can be found on our website https://rowner.gfmat.org/for-parents/school-uniform-2/ A reminder that make-up, fake nails etc should not be worn in school and that our policy surrounding jewellery is:

Jewellery: Children should not wear any jewellery (with the exception of watches) apart from a single or pair of **stud earrings** in pierced ears. The school cannot accept any responsibility or liability for mislaid personal jewellery. To help keep your child safe, earrings need to be removed for PE lessons. We suggest they are not worn at all on PE days.

Sun Safety









We are looking forward to the sun shining and children thoroughly enjoying being outside. To help keep them safe in the sun, please remember sun safety messages: 'slip, slop, slap'. Sun safety experts recommend:

- **Slip** on sun protective, pale clothing that covers as much of your body as possible.
- Slop on SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen, at least 20 minutes before sun exposure.
- Slap on a sun hat that shades your face, neck and ears. We do not mind what colour this is.

We have been made aware that some Nivea sun creams now contain almond oil and we do have some pupils in school with nut allergies - please bear this in mind when applying sunscreen for school - thank you.

Swimming

Our swimming programme is well under way. Please see the table above for your child's swimming schedule. This will form part of the PE curriculum for the summer term and will take place at Brune Park school. Swimming is part of the National Curriculum and therefore <u>all</u> children are expected to take part. Children need to have the appropriate swimwear, **not beachwear**, boy's trunks should be above the knee in length and girls must wear a one piece swimming costume. Goggles are permitted if your child would prefer to wear them. Long hair needs to be tied back and we encourage jewellery to be left at home – no earrings please on the days when they are swimming. We encourage children to wear swimming caps. Children will also need to bring a towel and waterproof bag to bring their kit into school. If children wear their swimming costumes to school as it is a morning session, please ensure they have underwear to change into. All swimming kit and school uniform needs to be named.
