The Atelier








Children attend the Atelier, to help develop their communication and interaction skills in an engaging artistic context.

They demonstrated great interpersonal skills, and developed their understanding of how to keep themselves safe in the kitchen.



The group have been developing their speaking and listening skills through their natural wonders of the world project. The children have been really engaged in the learning, which has facilitated lots of discussions on the topic. The Grand Canyon was particularly popular, with children talking at length about the size of the canyon and how it was formed. Cross curricular links were made with science learning (rocks), and they were amazed by the different colours of the sedimentary rock that are visible. The children had never heard of this natural wonder, and were excited to tell their grown ups about it too.

With a focus on positive interactions and turn taking, we have continued using the theme of the wonders of the world in our Atelier sessions. The children have enjoyed learning about Petra, asking lots of questions and using chalk pastels to create their artwork. We then moved onto the Colosseum, and began using a mosaic technique to build up their final piece of work.
